OTHER LEARNING AREAS

HASS - Students will investigate rights and responsibilities of Australian citizens, the experiences of Australian democracy, and citizenship for different groups in the past.
 Science - Students investigate changes that can be made to materials and how these changes are classified as reversible or irreversible. Students identify and assess risks, make observations, accurately record data and develop explanations.

Visual Arts - Students will plan, design and create a mixed media artwork piece based on an animal from an Indigenous story.

Health and Physical Education - Miss Agnes Dalton-Health: Let's all be active - Students will explore the health-related fitness components of a range of physical activities and the importance of physical activity participation to health and wellbeing. They will apply the elements of movement to compose and perform a fitness activity station that develops a health-related fitness component.

PE: Free Running: Students perform free running skills including running, jumping, landing, balancing and safety rolls. They combine free running skills, movement concepts and strategies to complete obstacle courses.

Digital Technologies - Students will explore and explain how information systems meet local and community needs, represent a variety of data types in digital systems, design and create an interactive spreadsheet on Excel information ethically.

Music and Drama - Miss Jess McDonald - Music: Students will continue practising for their performances of My Paddle on the instruments, while singing. They will perform this for an audience when ready.

Drama: students will begin creating their melodrama stories in small groups, that they will then perform for an audience.
