ENGLISH

Students will create and edit a written story using a known character.

MATHEMATICS

OTHER LEARNING AREAS

HASS: Students will be learning about the changes of technology through time. They will be exploring different types of technology and learning to pose questions to compare them to each other.

Drama: Students will develop acting and improvising skills by engaging with various imaginative texts to experiment with creating and performing Drama. They will also respond to Drama that they make, perform, and view. Classes will also continue preparing for the Roma and District Eisteddfod, and the Primary Christmas Concert later in the term (Miss Jess McDonald).

Physical Education: Students demonstrate fundamental movement skills (instep pass, punt kick and one hand strike) and test alternatives to solve movement challenges (to reach their targets).

Health: Students explore safe and unsafe situations so that they understand their responsibility in staying safe. They examine the safety clues that can be used in situations and identify that the emotions they feel in response to safe and unsafe situations. Students consider different aspects of sun safety and how they can promote their health, safety and wellbeing (Miss Aggie Dalton).

Media Arts: This semester, students will use digital manipulation to present alternative representations of family portraiture (Mrs Kate Crawford).
