END OF SEMESTER REPORTING

Families of students from Prep – Year 10 received their End of Semester 1 Report Cards via email on Thursday June 26. Year 11 and 12 reports for Units 1 and 3 respectively were emailed home on Friday June 13. Please contact the school administration if you have had any difficulties in receiving the email with the report card attached.

Academic reporting involves communicating information to parents, carers and students about student achievement and progress for each learning area/subject undertaken, at a point in time. Reporting builds the school-parent partnership to improve student learning. School reporting processes are clear and transparent for parents, so they understand:

- · the learning expectations for the student;
- · the student's achievement against expected standards;
- how well the student is engaging with the expected learning; and
- · how the student may be able to improve

When we report on the progress of our students, this is an important part of the feedback process to our students. We aim to ensure our students understand how they are going academically, what they are doing well, how they can improve and how we can help this improvement to occur.

As a college, we are required to use a five-point scale to report on our students. This looks different in different year levels i.e., Prep – Year 2 and Years 3-12. In Prep -Year 2, 'Working With' and Years 3-12 'C' indicate a similar result where a student is able to demonstrate the requirements of their year level at that point in time in familiar situations. This result is a great achievement – one deserving of being celebrated.



This week we have had a number of Year 10, 11 & 12 students participating in Work Experience with some wonderful local businesses. Work Experience is a great way to sample vocational pathways and we commend these students for representing Roma State College with pride throughout the week!

Work Experience will be available to Year 10,11 & 12 students again in week 10 of Term 3. If you think this is something that may be of benefit to your student, please do not hesitate to contact our Industry Liaison Officer Mrs Bain

UPDATE ON PROPOSED COLOCATION (AMALGAMATION) OF PRIMARY




